Wearing masks on planes and trains is not required but strongly recommended

Preparing to Travel to Canada: Can. Government

 Download the ArriveCan App (optional) and complete an advance declaration at participating airports.
Vancouver, Toronto, Montreal-Trudeau, Winnipeg, and Halifax, among others: <u>ArriveCAN optional feature: Advance CBSA Declaration - Canada.ca</u>

2. Gather supporting documents for entering Canada. This may include (but is not limited to): a port of entry letter of introduction that shows you were approved for a study permit, a valid letter of acceptance from NBCC, and proof that you have enough money to support yourself and any family members who come with you to Canada.

Boarding the flight: what should you have?

Passport

Proof of Medical Exam (if applicable)

Letter of Introduction from IRCC (study permit approval letter)

NBCC Letter of Acceptance

eTA/Temporary Resident Visa (Canadian entry document) NBCC Travel Support Letter (<u>www.nbcc.ca/travel-guide</u>)

You will complete a customs declaration (you can use ArriveCAN to do this in advance).

You will approach a counter to speak to a Canada Border



At the Canadian Border: what happens?

Even if you have been approved for a study permit, the border officer makes the final decision on your entry to Canada.

You must complete this step at your port-of-entry airport







At the Canadian Border: what happens?

Declare any currency (CAD or otherwise) and monetary instruments that you are bringing into Canada that is more than CAD \$10 000




